German 4 is the third level of German High School instruction in German language. Students will be completing work in preparation for advanced German language study, educational and personal travel, business, higher education, and inter-cultural communication. Students will not need to complete a NYS assessment upon conclusion of this class. A local final examination will be given. German 4 is a prerequisite for German 5 and students are encouraged to continue, as college credit may be earned by completing German 5.

Students will be completing thematic units to increase their German language skills. All aspects of German second language development will be addressed including: Spoken and Written language, Listening and Reading comprehension, as well as history, culture and current events. The student text for this class is Deutsch Aktuell, level 3. Students will be working with a great deal of authentic materials, including song, film and German Internet websites.

Grading: As per school and LOTE departmental requirements, a weighted category system will be employed to determine student grades. 50% of the students grade will be based on student performance on assessments (Tests, quizzes and projects) and 50% will be based in in class and homework assignments. Homework shall not exceed a total of 20% of a student's grade.

German 3 is the second level of German High School instruction in German language. Students will earn Advanced Regent's credit in Foreign Language upon successful completion of this course. Students will be completing work in preparation for advanced German language study, educational and personal travel, business, higher education, and inter-cultural communication. Students will be completing a comprehensive NYS State examination in June. Students are encouraged to continue with German study in levels 4 and 5 upon successful completion of this course. College credit is offered to students who complete the fifth level in their senior year.

Students will be completing thematic units to increase their German language skills. All aspects of German second language development will be addressed including: Spoken and Written language, Listening and Reading comprehension, as well as history, culture and current events. The student text for this class is Deutsch Aktuell, level 2. Students will be working with a great deal of authentic materials, including song, film and German Internet websites.

Grading: As per school and LOTE departmental requirements, a weighted category system will be employed to determine student grades. 50% of the students grade will be based on student performance on assessments (Tests, quizzes and projects) and 50% will be based in in class and homework assignments. German 5 is the fourth level of German High School instruction in German language. Students will be completing work in preparation for advanced German language study, educational and personal travel, business, higher education, and inter-cultural communication. A comprehensive final examination is required in this class. Students may earn 3 hours of Hilbert College credit in German 103, upon completion of this course. In order to receive this credit, Students will need to complete the registration form and pay the registration fee of \$100, payable to Hilbert, pass the final examination, and earn a 73 or higher overall grade. This credit is generally transferable to any university that the student may attend. Registration forms will be provided by the instructor in early spring.

Students will be completing thematic units to increase their German language skills. All aspects of German second language development will be addressed including: Spoken and Written language, Listening and Reading comprehension, as well as history, culture and current events. The student text for this class is Deutsch Aktuell, level 3. Students will be working with a great deal of authentic materials, including song, film and German Internet websites.
