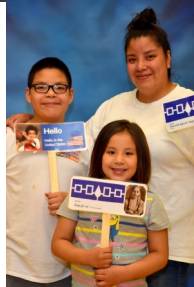
JT Waugh Has Talent

Unified Basketball

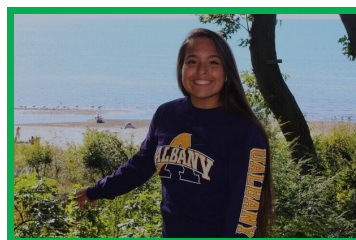
